20th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Gospel is a great comfort to us, especially in times of sorrow and trouble. But its also a great challenge. It challenges us to shun darkness and to opt for the light, to be with Christ rather than against him. Let us reflect on this to see where we stand – with Christ or against him. Let us ask the Lord to help us to be true to his Gospel.

Lord Jesus, you hear us when we cry to you for help. Lord, have mercy. You strengthen us when we are weak and indecisive. Christ, have mercy. You shed you light on us when we are in darkness. Lord, have mercy.

A swamp may look nice on the surface, but its depths are full of rotten things. Peace that is based on injustice is like that. It is a false peace and Jesus came to disrupt it. But then there is true peace – a peace in which all of God's children have their basic rights respected, and are able to live in freedom and dignity. This is the peace Jesus came to bring. But peace like this doesn't happen; it has to be made. Sometimes the peacemakers will be branded troublemakers. But Jesus had another name for them: he called them "children of God".

OUR DEEPEST FEAR

Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness that most frightens us.

We ask ourselves, who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented and fabulous? Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small does not serve the world.

There's nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine, as children do. We are born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It's not just in some of us; it's in everyone.

And as we let our own light shine we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others.
