
IN MEMORIAM

HOPE RESTORED

Easter, which celebrates Christ's victory over sin and death, ought to be, for all of us, the feast of hope restored. Yet, all too often it can be a time of hopelessness; perhaps because of the death of a loved one; because of some personal trauma or, in our present time, because of extremely difficult material circumstances. The story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus is one of the most cherished among the accounts of Christ's post-resurrection appearances. For the disciples listening to the stranger re-tell the story of Jesus changed everything. Something in their humanity was transformed. Instead of being closed in on themselves and on their sorrows to the exclusion of others, they changed and urged the stranger to share the intimacy of their evening meal. He agreed and as they sat together they recognised him in the breaking of the Bread. Then, he disappeared.

"Easter occurs when we find in Jesus, not a dear friend but a living stranger." Jesus has changed but it is the disciples who still need to change.
